

FIRST RECOGNITION FOR ENVIRONMENTAL DEFENSE IN CHIAPAS 2019

"MARIANO ABARCA"

This November 27, 2019, marks the 10th anniversary of the murder of Mariano Abarca Roblero, an environmentalist who defended Human Rights and the Rights of Nature in his hometown of Chicomuselo, Chiapas, Mexico. Mariano was killed for denouncing the socio-environmental impacts caused by the Canadian mining company Blackfire Exploration, also in his murder. Since then, his family and various organizations have engaged in a long process before the Mexican and Canadian governments to demand justice and punishment to those guilty for: the proven corruption of the company, the actions and omissions of the Canadian Embassy that may have contributed to Mariano's murder, as well as references to the Mexican government's apparent impunity. They also have ongoing processes before the Canadian courts and the Inter-American Commission on Human Rights (IACHR).

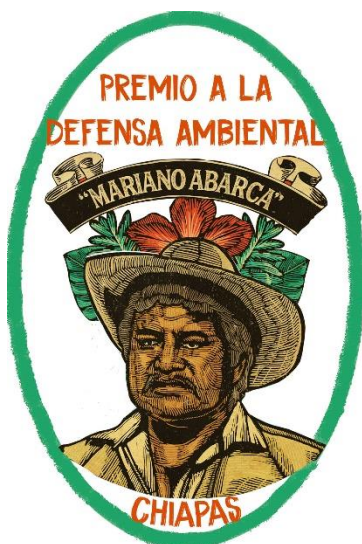
Despite Mariano Abarca's murder, throughout the country, and particularly in the state of Chiapas, many other defenders continue to fight and demonstrate for the defense of the Earth and the Territory, for Life and for Mother Earth against the policies, politicians and megaprojects, who in violently appropriating natural goods ultimately threaten the culture and identity of indigenous peoples, peasants, as well as the life of the urban population.

In this context, the Convocants commemorate the **First Recognition for Environmental Defense in Chiapas 2019 "Mariano Abarca"** as part of the Tenth Anniversary of mourning Mariano Abarca, with the purpose of thanking, recognizing and making visible other collective and organized struggles of those who, do not cease to defend life, the environment and collective rights that are, after all, for the benefit of Humanity. Mariano sowed this spirit in the hearts of the resistance

The "**Mariano Abarca Award**" 2019 will be presented to the indigenous organization of the **Movement in Defense of Life and Territory** ([MODEVITE](#)), who have a presence in 11 municipalities in the state of Chiapas. This **Recognition** will be delivered on November 27 of the current year at the Auditorium of Fine Arts of the Historic Center of San Cristóbal de las Casas, Chiapas, Mexico in the company of representatives of national and international organizations and convening networks, as well as the Abarca family.

The "**Mariano Abarca Award**" will also provide an important occasion to share the experiences of other collective struggles in defense of the Earth and the Territory. And so, on the same day we will hold the **Forum of Environmental Defense in Chiapas "Mariano Abarca"**, with the participation of peoples representing the ongoing resistance processes in the North, Costa and Altos areas of the State of Chiapas. We will also learn a bit about

the resistance being carried out in the Montaña and Costa Chica of the State of Guerrero, and, panelists and specialists will share an analysis of the situation of violence against environmental defenders in order to enrich the collective exchange [Agenda](#).
